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Historical places of assam pdf

Today in this post, I will share with you some amazing information about the top 12 historical sites in the state of Assam. But before we start, I would like to give you a brief introduction to today's topic. This is an invariable truth that Assam has a history of struggle, war and love. Curiosity: The beautiful Rank Ghar These epic stories of love and war, the history of fighting has been creating some incredible and amazing historical monuments at different times in the land of Assam. And because of these things, the result we are getting today the story of Assam and its historical sites. So, my friend, if you are fascinated to hear the history of Assam through these 12 awesome places, then I can tell you that you are exactly in the right place. So, let's start with the first destination... Curiosity: Image of Agnigarh 12 most beautiful historic sites of Assam Charaideo and his maids Charaideo was part of sivasagar district until 2015, but today it is a self-administered district of the state of Assam. On August 15, 2015, the state's honorable chief minister, Mr. Tarun Gogoi, declared it a new administrative district of Assam. At present, if anyone asks a rehearsed person about the first capital of the kingdom of Ahom, then they usually answer, their Charaideo. But that's not the full truth. The first capital of Ahom was 'Burhadangoria Thaan' which is located in a place called Tipaam'. Swargadeo Chaolung Sukaphaa regarded 'Burhadangoria Thaan' as its temporary capital; therefore, its popularity is much lower than Charaideo. However, historically Burhadangoria Thaan is also a very important place. Curiosity: Historic Sites of Assam, Charaideo A Burhadangoria Thaan, ruled for only 25 years. But in Charaideo they ruled for more than 250 years (until the beginning of the 16th century). Charaideo was the place where the great Ahom dynasty began to write the first chapter in the history of Assam. In 1253, the first Ahom king Chaolung Sukaphaa established his kingdom in Charaideo. It later expanded into a giant empire around the entire Brahmaputra Valley. There the memory of kings Ahom still very well reserved of almost 900 years as tombs. Today, these tombs are popular as Charaideo Maidam. Many people, even the intellect want to compare, Charaideo tombs with the pyramids of ancient Egypt. I think you have to see the beauty of those 'Maidam' to understand or get an idea about the great story of Assam. Especially, parents should bring their children here. It will help them better understand their history and also make them more respectful of their past ancestors. Here, below and above, we shared two images of Charaideo Maidam. You can see and understand how it really looks. Awesome, now site number 2..... Curiosity: Beautiful image of Charaideo Maidam Ghar - First Asia Pavilion Today Rank Ghar is world famous for its beauty and upper-class architecture. Through this incredible construction, we can high skill sets of these ahom. Even Rang Ghar is the sign of his mindset towards living a lavish life. With comparison with Delhi's Red Fort, it is also known as the Red Fort of Assam. Ahom Swargadeo (or King) Pramatta Singha built this masterpiece during his ruling era (Years between 1744-1750). But you know what, that wasn't his fundamental assumption? Earlier, Pramatta Singha's father, Rudra Singha, built it with bamboo and wood. But ironically, its composition was not of a very high standard. And of course, it was inevitable because of wood and bamboo. Therefore, his son Pramatta Singha had to build again with stone and brick after his death. The Ghar Range we see today built during the days of Swargadeo Pramatta Singha. Do you have any idea, why was it built? In those days it was used as an entertainment pavilion. On many occasions (especially in the seasons of Magh and Bohag Bihu), the Ahom kings organized here various sports and festivals. Like Bihu dance, Buffalo fighting, human struggle or judo, chicken fighting, bulbul fighting birds, and more. However, these traditions are still available on some special occasions. Oh wait, I have to tell you that Rang Ghar has the prestige of being the first Pavilion on the Asian continent. As a rehearsed person, I really feel proud of that. It is currently an important part of the Assam government's tourism programme. Okay, now it's time to move to another historic site. This is no other than Borhill. You want to go? Then let's go for it... Curiosity: Rank Ghar Image Borhill - Hilly Picnic Site Borhill is a beautiful little picnic corner, falls into the Nazi division subdi division of Sivasagar district. I think definitely borhill's love, peaceful surroundings and natural beauty. Here Borhill Falls is the most attractive destination for your visitors. But something you should remember earlier preceded that even though Borhill enters the Assam area, but part of it also enters the Nagaland area. And that part is Borhill falls entering the Nagaland area. Of course, you know, Nagaland is a border state of Assam. A belief has been running ever since very old, around 300 year in January. Curiosity: Picnic Spot Borhill Kareng Ghar – Gargaon Palace In 1751 Kareng Ghar was built by Pramatta Singha (Sunenphaa). Of course, it was the same commissioned by Asia's first pavilion, the Ghar Rank. The Kareng that was built by Pramatta Singha was destroyed a few years later and was rebuilt again by Rajeswar Singha. (Pramatta Singha's younger brother) This is one of a example of Ahom architecture. Kareng Ghar falls in Gargaon (Today a small place in sivasagar district, near the Nazira subdi division). It also has several names, such as Gargaon Palace, Raj Kareng, etc. Curiosity: Kareng Ghar Image Jorhat – The City of Culture Assamese Jorhat is the cultural center of Assam. After Guwahati, it has the prestige of being the second city in the state. You know, Jorhat is also described as the city of rehearsed culture. The main importance of Jorhat is Majuli and several Satras (Satras are the religious sites of neovasnavism). But how and why? Because the impact of Assamese Saint Srimanta Sankardev's great Neo-Family culture is very deep in these places. The most significant thing is that you need to know that Majuli is the largest river island in Assam and even India. Although Majuli is not an administrative part of Jorhat district today. Because in 2015 the Government of Assam declared it a self-administered district of the state. But whatever, I'm sure you'll love it. Curiosity: The Historical Bornamghar Dhekiakhowa If you prefer then you can go to the other tourist sites of Jorhat, such as the Tocklai tea research center, Lachit Borphukon Maidam, Jorhat science center, and planetarium, Dhekiakhowa Bornamghar, and the tea estate Cinamora, etc. The Cinamora tea estate was Assam's first tea garden, founded by revolutionary businessman Maniram Dewan. Am I boring you? If I do then I'm sorry, but I won't let you go until I finish (Ok jokes apart) So far, we have recognized you with 5 historic sites of Assam. Now let's talk about the other 7... Curiosity: Guwahati Tourism Tezpur – The City of Mythology Why is Tezpur famous? Do you have any ideas? Actually, the main reasons are Agnigarh, Kohla Bhomora Setu and Nameri National Park, etc. Most importantly, Tezpur has a mythological history written in ancient Indian epics, and that's... The epic story of Usha-Aniruddha's love and the Hari-Hara war. These things make it more prosperous and famous among Indians. According to the Indian epic Mahabharata, King Bana made the Agnigarh to avoid love between Usha and Anirudha, who later took responsibility for the Hari-Hara war (War between Lord Krishna (Hari) and Shiva (Hara)). In that war, the river of blood was swept away and Sonitpur's chest turned red with its color. The place where the war happened and blood rivers were flooded, later named Tezpur (City of Blood). We shared the full story in another article. If you want, you can check it out. Apart from historical elements, Tezpur is also rich in natural beauty. Sila Saku- Bridge of Stone During the rule of Ahom King Shiva Singha, a bridge was made in Sivasagar with the structure of complete stones. Today this stone-made bridge is popular as 'Sila Saku' from Assam. Although, it's not that big, but very strong. It's too close to city of Simlugini, a Nazir subdivision. This stone bridge is still in its own position the power and dignity of the kingdom of Ahom. However, traveling across this bridge has stopped today; after all, it already crosses 200 years. Curiosity: Guwahati Kamakhya Guwahati Temple - The gateway to northeastern India Today Guwahati is important because the capital of Assam is located on this site. Yes, as you know, it's Koinadhora from Dispur. But is it just the cause of his popularity? Um..... of course not. Why? Because he also has too many other reasons for his popularity. They're like, it's the gateway to all of northeastern India and on the other hand, Guwahati is the place, which has been observing too many historical sites in its heart since Indian mythological antiquity. Like Kamakhya Temple, Nilachal Pahar, Umananda Temple, Tirupati Sri Balaji Temple, and even more. During the month of June, many people of the Hindu religion come to Guwahati to visit the temple of Kamakhya to celebrate Ambubasi Mela. The image above is of kamakhya temple. According to the belief of Hinduism, this is the most powerful mascot among the 51. Also, exploring the temple of Umananda is also another great thing for travelers. Mainly people love it because of its presence in the heart of the mighty Brahmaputra River. Curiosity: Talatal Ghar Talatal Ghar - The largest construction of Ahom's once Talatal Ghar age was the central army base of the ancient kingdom of Ahom. After moving from Gargaon Palace, the kingdom's capital was changed to Talatal Ghar. Swargadeo Rudra Singha began building Talatal Ghar in the 16th century. It is a house where there are many puzzling doors, and hundreds of rooms created (top of the floor and floor, everywhere). The people of Assam still believe that if someone gets lost in Talatal Ghar then it becomes too difficult for him to be founded by someone. Ahom Kings built this house to keep his arms and war strategies hidden. Swargadeo began building this site after the invasion of Assam of Mirjumla. Because Mirjumla happened in the invasion of the kingdom of Ahom when its capital was in Gargaon. Curiosity: Talatal Ghar Do you know another amazing fact about this mysterious palace? The mystery was, once there were two roads at the bottom of Talatal Ghar. One way to get to Kareng Ghar, who is 10 miles away and another was on the Dikhow River, which is 4.3 miles away. However, today these roads are blocked due to heavy clay jams. These things show how Ahom's were aware of his security affairs and also demonstrate why they were able to rule the entire Brahmaputra Valley for 600 years. Really Talatal Ghar is a great place to see. Curiosity: Beautiful Lachit Borphukan Maidam Lachit Borphukan Maidam – Tomb of the Great Maid Lachit Worried or Lachit Borphukan Maidam is the tomb of the great Ahom worried Lachit Borphukan. This beautiful is located in the Jorhat district, about 9.5 mi from the main town of Jorhat. In 1672 Ahom Swargadeo Udyaditya Singha established it, in the the great patriot ahom. The worst is especially famous for the Battle of Saraighat, where he and his patriotic army overthrew the powerful Mogols in decisive warfare. The most important thing is that the Ahom army was too weak that the Mogol army during naval battle time. Curiosity: Historical sites in Assam, Lachit Maidam After this decisive battle, the intention of the Mogols became much weaker to rule in Assam again. His patriotism was so high that he even beheaded his uncle (Mama) because he ignored the country's security issue. Lachit's famous quote 'Dekhoikoi Momai Dangor Nohoi' is still very popular with the people of Assam. Often seen, today's rehearsed politicians use their quote for their own political benefits. You can also visit this place to discover this great personality of medieval Assam. There are so many things that keep there related to him. The image above is by Lachit Maidam. The location is Norahiloidari Gaon, near 37 national highway, Jorhat. Curiosity: Sivasagar Borpukhuri Sivasagar Borpukhuri – Huge Sivasagar Tin Tank made by men or simply known as Sivasagar Borpukhuri is a large human tank of Assam. It even has a good position throughout Asia. This large pond is located in the Sivasagar district of Assam, in the city of Sivasagar. The Sivadoli, Vishnudol, Devidol, is located on the banks of this historic site. According to some sources of Assam's history, this was built in the early years of the 18th century. Ahom Swargadeo, the wife of Siva Singha Phuleshwari Konwari, also known as Red Boro Ambika commissioned this pond in the 1734 century. This great historical masterpiece already crossed 286 years of his life, but people are often confused thinking, as Ahom was able to do without any technological support. I think we should greet workers for their hard work. Currently, this pond is home to different migratory and residential birds. One can come here to shoot pictures of these birds, along with enjoying the beauty of Sivasagar. Along with that, this is a good dating site for couples. Curiosity: Gorokhya Dol Gorokhya Dol is also one of assam's historic sites, although it is not among the popular. The location and tourism department of Assam are probably the two factors responsible for this cause. Gorokhya Dol is a Shiite temple, which was built in the Ahom era. Ahom Swargadeo Gadadhar Singha built it in the Nomati area of sivasagar district, Nazira subdivision. Recently, a few years ago, a local business person tried to introduce it as a picnic spot (around the year 2016). But now, due to some causes, it closes again. If you want, also visit this site. But the only thing I want to clarify that because of their location near the jungle tigers also sometimes happen here. So, please be careful during the visit. Visit. Hopefully this site will help you learn a lot of facts about the history of Assam. I think I should once visit all these places.
